The 2012 seasonal exhibition 'Schools out' continues until the autumn.


#### STOP PRESS

# CAN YOU HELP BE A VOLUNTEER AT HISTORYLINKS?

The Dornoch Heritage Society (DHS) was founded in 1983, to preserve the artefacts and memories of the town and to provide a social focus for members. The museum seeks to tell the story of Dornoch and the surrounding area.

The museum relies heavily on the enthusiasm and commitment of its volunteer staff, and recognises the immeasurable value of their contribution to the existence of the organisation.

#### Reception and Shop Attendant

This is the principal post for which the museum recruits volunteers. This post represents the first point of contact with our customers and as such is crucial to the organisation. The job is basically about greeting and welcoming customers, recording admissions and selling shop goods. You do NOT need to be a historian as you will not be left on you own unless you are happy to do so.

#### Can you help?

#### Gardening and General Maintenance

If you feel you could mow the lawn once a month, clean the trail signs or paint a window **do get** in touch.

#### Project work

Education, outreach, oral history and other museum activity projects can be very rewarding. Why not get involved?

#### **Collection Cataloguing**

Volunteers for this work should be computer literate and have an eye to detail. In addition to basic induction training, it is commonplace for volunteers in this post to work alongside members of the existing collection cataloguing team.

#### Photography and document scanning

All objects acquired for the museum collection are photographed or scanned and the cataloguing team is greatly assisted by volunteers.

#### Marketing

Raising the profile and marketing is vital to keep visitor numbers up. We need volunteers to drop off leaflets at the start of the season and with hotels and visitor attractions to top up on a regular basis every few weeks.

#### **Fund Raising**

A key roll of the Heritage Society that underpins many of the museums operations.
